Challenges

• Farmers

- Shortage of resources
 - Water and Fodder shortage is still persisting.
- Planting season has lapsed.
- Increase prices for commodities.
- Prediction of prolonged drought
- Across the Province
 - Food security
 - Job losses
 - Migration
 - Conflict (farm invasions)



Feed required for cattle in KZN

• At a survival rate of 3.6 kg/LSU/Day the province would require R 701.1 million to feed the livestock for one month



Interventions

- R114 million was allocated (R45 million conditional grant and R69 million equitable share).
- The approved scheme was as follows:
- Phase 1:
 - Procurement of inputs for livestock and water harvesting
 - Procurement of Fodder for livestock R 60 million (R36 million CASP & Ilima Letsema; R24 million DARD equitable share
- Phase 2:
 - Aggressive de-worming of livestock (Veterinary Services) amounting to R 9 million (CASP)
- Phase 3:
 - Borehole drilling and earth-dam scooping R 45 million (DARD Equitable Share)
- Phase 4
 - Identification of state land for grazing.
- The total cost for this intervention is R60 million
- Registered livestock feed (feed/hay), registered licks, registered Ruminant Drought pellets, Multi-vitamins, Vaccines, Bales, Dip, salt, Registered dairy meal, and Fodder.
- Water provision through-water harvesting

Intervention 2

Deworming campaign

- The campaign has been rolled out in all 1600 communal dip tanks started 20 November 2015.
- Approximately 260 000 cattle have been de-wormed to date.
- The total cost for this intervention is **R9 million, spent so far R6.5 million.**

Borehole drilling

- Submission has been approved to appoint suppliers using for drilling 62 boreholes.
- The boreholes were allocated an amount of R 19 million
- Borehole drilling commenced on the 11/01/2016.

• In addition it is estimated that 62 will be drilled.

Intervention 3

Dam scooping

• In addition it is estimated that 75 dams will be scooped at a cost of approximately R 26 million.

Intervention 4

Identification of State land for Grazing

- Rural Development and Land Reform has identified state land that could potentially be used as grazing.
- DARD has surveyed the state land to establish whether there is sufficient grass to warrant moving livestock to those areas
- The investigation of state land other than PLAS farms have been concluded and have not delivered any positive results.

Conclusion

Drought Responses so far

- R114 million was allocated for drought.
- R69 million of the total came from CASP and Ilima reprioritization.
- So far R45 million of CASP used.
- Small, medium and large scale livestock farmers were assisted
- Feed, medicines and deworming of animals was provided .
- 75 dams being scooped and 62 boreholes being drilled.
