MEC for Economic Development and Environmental Affairs Mr. Sakhumzi Somyo and KZN MEC for Agriculture and Rural Development Mr. Cyril Xaba, attended the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between DTI, ECDEDEA, ECDRDAR and Nestle' for the production of chicory by entrant farmers in the Eastern Cape Province.

The production of chicory has been in the forefront of the farming sector in the Eastern Cape for over 100 years. It has seen the Province being a global leader in the production of the commodity. The province's climatic setup, type of soil etc. is a contributing factor to chicory farming being the biggest supplier in the country but recently, the Province of KwaZulu-Natal ventured into planting of the commodity and is tapping into this new market as research has shown that there is huge potential. Since 2008, KwaZulu-Natal has grown in leaps and bounds to make this a success.
