

SERVICE CENTRE BRINGS SERVICES CLOSER TO MONDLO RESIDENTS

The MEC for Co-operative Governance and Traditional Affairs Nomusa Dube-Ncube together with the MEC for KZN Agriculture and Rural Development Cyril Xaba, officially opened the R7 Million Mondlo Thusong Centre on 17 September 2015, just outside Vryheid.

The Centre houses offices for various government departments such as Home Affairs, Labour, the Post Office, SASSA and many more.

According to MEC Dube-Ncube, there are currently 32 **Centre's** that are scattered across the Province including Mbazwana, Nquthu, Mpendle and Phongola. MEC Dube-Ncube said that the main aim is to ensure that residents do not have to travel long distances in order to get access to government services.

The Centre also has a computer training facility which trains the youth and will also assist with their research for school projects.

MEC Dube-Ncube believes that the provision of such services to communities ensure that they are better able to get access to government information.
