He was on hand to watch the judging of the RAS Challenge for haltertrained animals at the Royal Show at the weekend.

Addressing students from Cedara College of Agriculture, Mtubatuba Mini Farm, Owen Sithole College of Agriculture, the University of KwaZulu-Natal and Hoër Landbouskool Vryheid, he said it was important to encourage more young people to get into the agricultural industry.

Mtubatuba Mini Farm also did exceptionally well in the contest for halter-trained steers, winning the under 350 kg, 350 kg to 399 kg and 400 kg to 449 kg categories.

The big winner in the unhaltertrained steers was Fererro Bonsmaras.
