TERMS OF REFERENCE

APPOINTMENT OF SERVICE PROVIDERS TO SUPPLY, DELIVER AND OFFLOAD LIME, GYPSUM AND FERTILIZER (INCLUDING MICRONUTRIENTS AND SPECIALITY PRODUCTS)

1. BACKGROUND

1.1. The department intends to appoint suitable qualified service provider to supply and deliver lime, gypsum and fertilizer including speciality products as specified below:

2. OBJECTIVES

- 2.1. To appoint suitably qualified Service Provider to supply agricultural fertilizer and fertilizer supplements in all KZN Districts.
- 2.2. To ensure effective, efficient and timely supply of fertilizer and fertilizer supplements to resource-poor and emerging farmers.
- 2.3. To create sustainable food (crop and livestock) production in poverty-stricken rural communities.
- 2.4. To support the establishment of sustainable fertilizer suppliers as part of Agrarian Socio-Economic Transformation

3. SCOPE OF SERVICES

- 3.1. The Department requires Service Provider to supply, deliver and offload fertilizer and fertilizer supplements to its local offices and/or beneficiary farmsteads.

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS
APPOINTMENT OF SERVICE PROVIDERS TO SUPPLY, DELIVER AND OFFLOAD

- (a) Service providers must ensure that they are fully aware of all the Conditions contained in this quotation documents.
- (b) Only Service provider that fully meet the prequalification shall be considered.

1. ACCEPTANCE OF QUOTATION

- 1.1. The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development Bid Adjudication Committee is under no obligation to accept any quotation.

2. AMENDMENT OF CONTRACT

- 2.1. Any amendment to or renunciation of the provisions of the contract shall at all times be done in writing and shall be signed by both parties, subject to the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development Bid Adjudication Committee approval.

3. AWARD

- 3.1. This quotation will be awarded to one (1) service provider.
- 3.2. The grand total quotation price on **Annexure A-1 to Annexure A-28** must be transferred to *Overall Price Schedule* of this document.
- 3.3. It is a condition of this quotation that service providers must quote for all items in **Annexure A-1 to Annexure A-28**. Failure to comply will result in disqualification.

4. BASIS AND QUANTITIES

- 3.4. Quantities are reflected in this quotation document. Service providers must therefore quote per unit price as required in the **Annexure A-1 to Annexure A-28**

5. CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE

- 5.1. Where applicable fertilizers and fertilizer supplements offered, must be registered
- 5.2. in terms of Section 3(1) of the Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act (Act No 36 of 1947) (As Amended) and all further regulations issued in terms of the said Act.
- 5.3. Servicer providers must submit a valid certificate/s of registration issued by the Department of

5.4. Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development for each product offered with the quotation. The registration number of each product offered must be stated against the relevant item number in the pricing schedule where applicable.

6. CHANGE OF ADDRESS

6.1. Service providers must advise the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development Supply Chain Management, Contract Administration should their ownership or address (domicilium citandi et executandi) details change from the time of bidding to the expiry of the contract.

7. COUNTER OFFERS

7.1. Counter offers will not be considered.

8. DELIVERY AND PACKAGING

8.1. Basis of delivery: Delivery of goods shall be made as directed by the Department as per the price page.

8.2. All deliveries must take place from Monday to Friday between 08h00 and 15h00.

8.3. In emergency cases, the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development reserves the right to request the successful servicer provider/s to effect deliveries at any given time including Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays.

8.4. The delivery performance of a contractor will be closely monitored, and any subsequent orders will only be issued to the contractor that has proved to be competent with their delivery performance.

8.5. The Department reserves the right to undertake random inspection and sampling of items upon delivery to verify quantity and compare the item against the contract sample and any other quality accreditation that is prescribed.

8.6. It is the contractor's responsibility to offload the delivery vehicle.

8.7. Every order shall be accompanied by a delivery note.

8.8. The following information must appear on the outer packaging:

- (a) Name of the manufacturer/supplier
- (b) Description of item
- (c) Lot Number and Expiry date
- (d) Unit of measure

8.9. All packaging and labelling must comply with the requirements of the Act (Act 36 of 1947).

9. DELIVERY CONDITIONS

9.1. Delivery of products must be made in accordance with the instructions appearing on the official purchase order.

9.2. All deliveries or dispatches must be accompanied by a delivery note stating the official

9.3. purchase order number against the delivery that has been affected.

9.4. In respect of items awarded to them, contractors must adhere strictly to the delivery periods stipulated by them in their quotation document.

9.5. The instructions appearing on the official purchase order form regarding the supply, dispatch and submission of invoices must be strictly adhered to.

9.6. All invoices submitted must be original.

9.7. Deliveries not complying with the order form will be returned to the contractor at the

9.8. contractor's expense.

9.9. No locally manufactured product may be substituted during the contract period with an imported product, and vice versa, without prior approval of the Bid Adjudication Committee, Department of Agriculture and Rural Development.

10. ENTERING OF DEPARTMENTAL OFFICES

10.1. No representative from a company shall be permitted to enter Departmental premises, buildings or containers where stores are kept unless he/ she is accompanied by the responsible official in charge of stores.

11. EQUAL QUOTATIONS

10.2. If functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more service providers score equal total points and equal points for specific goals, the contract must be awarded to the service provider that scored the highest points for functionality.

10.3. If two or more service providers score equal total points in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

12. INVOICES

12.1. All invoices submitted by the Contractor must be Tax Invoices indicating quantity ordered and quantity delivered, the amount of tax charged and the total invoice amount.

12.2. A tax invoice shall be in the currency of the Republic of South Africa and shall contain the following particulars:

- (a) The name, address and registration number of the supplier;
- (b) The name and address of the recipient;
- (c) An individual serialized number and the date upon which the tax invoice is issued;
- (d) A description of the goods or services supplied;
- (e) The quantity or volume of the goods or services supplied
- (f) The value of the supply, the amount of tax charged and the consideration for the supply;
or
- (g) Where the amount of tax charged is calculated by applying the tax fraction to the consideration, the consideration for the supply and either the amount of the tax charged, or a statement that it includes a charge in respect of the tax and the rate at which the tax was charged.

13. IRREGULARITIES

13.1. Companies are encouraged to advise the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development timeously of any possible irregularities which might come to their notice in connection with this or other contracts.

14. JOINT VENTURES

14.1. In terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017 pertaining to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act 5 of 2000, a trust, consortium or joint venture must submit a consolidated B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificate for every separate quotation.

14.2. Should this quotation be submitted by a joint venture, the joint venture agreement must accompany

14.3. the quotation document before the closing date and time of quotation. The joint venture agreement must clearly specify the percentage of the contract to be undertaken by each company participating therein.

14.4. The non-submission of a B-BBEE Certificate by a trust, consortium or joint venture will result in zero (0) preference points being allocated for evaluation purposes.

14.5. Each party to a Joint Venture/ Consortium must submit an original valid Tax Clearance Certificate together with the quotation before the closing date and time of quotation.

14.6. The joint venture or consortium must submit a formal agreement that outlines the roles and responsibilities of each member of the joint venture or consortium, nomination of an

authorised person to represent the joint venture or consortium in all matters relating to this quotation and the details of the bank account for payments to be effected.

14.7. The joint venture or consortium must comply with Central Suppliers Database (CSD)

14.8. registration requirements as per National Treasury directive.

15. LATE QUOTATIONS

15.1. Quotations are late if they are received at the address indicated in the quotation documents after the closing date and time.

15.2. A late quotation shall not be considered and, where practical, shall be returned unopened to the Servicer provider, accompanied by an explanation.

16. NOTIFICATION OF AWARD OF QUOTATION

16.1. Notification of the award of quotation shall be in writing by a duly authorized official of the

16.2. Department of Agriculture and Rural Development, Supply Chain Management. The written acceptance of an offer constitutes a legal and binding contract.

16.3. The intention to award will be advertised in the same media as the invitation of the quotation and will be subject to confirmation of no appeals or finalization of the appeals process.

17. PAYMENT FOR SUPPLIES AND SERVICES

17.1. A contractor shall be paid by the Department in accordance with supplies delivered and services rendered.

17.2. Should a contractor indicate a special discount on his/her account provided payment is made within a certain time, the Department shall make every effort to take advantage of such discount.

17.3. Any query concerning the non-payment of accounts must be directed to the Department.

The following protocol will apply if accounts are queried:

- (i) Contact must be made with the officer-in-charge of the District Office;
- (ii) If there is no response from the District Office, the Director: Finance must be contacted;

17.4. Information as contained on the Central Suppliers Database must be valid/ correct. Non-compliance with Tax Requirements will affect payment.

18. PERIOD OF CONTRACT

18.1. The contract is a once off delivery as per annexure A-1 to Annexure A-28.

19. QUALITY CONTROL/ TESTING OF PRODUCTS

19.1. The department reserves the right to have fertilizer and fertilizer supplements offered by the tenderer in this quotation tested as part of the evaluation process. If any of the products is found unsuitable, the entire quotation will be disqualified.

19.2. For the duration of the contract, if it is discovered that the product supplied is not in accordance with the specification, the following will occur:

- (i) Testing charges will be for the account of the contractor;
- (ii) Possible cancellation of the contract with the contractor;
- (iii) Reporting such negligence by the contractor to the provincial and national treasury for listing on the restricted suppliers' database.

20. SITE INSPECTION

20.1. As part of the evaluation process of this quotation, the Department will conduct site inspections of premises of all suppliers who have submitted quotations and/or those suppliers who have issued letters of undertaking to bidders.

20.2. The purpose of the site inspections is to confirm validity and accuracy of the information submitted in the service provider's quotation document. Where the validity and accuracy of the information submitted in the service provider's quotation document cannot be confirmed during the site visit, the service provider will be disqualified.

21. SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

21.1. The quotation is issued in accordance with the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA), Chapter 16 A of the Treasury Regulations and shall be subject to the provisions of the General Conditions of Contract. The special terms and conditions are supplementary to that of the General Conditions of Contract. Where, however, the special terms and conditions are in conflict with the General Conditions of Contract, the Special Terms and Conditions will prevail.

22. SUPPLIERS DATABASE REGISTRATION

- 22.1. A servicer provider submitting an offer must be registered on the Central Suppliers Database at National Treasury. A servicer provider who has submitted an offer and is not registered on the Central Suppliers Database will not be considered at the time of award. No pending registrations will be considered.
- 22.2. Each party to a Joint Venture/Consortium must be registered on the Central Suppliers Database at the time of submitting the quotation.
- 22.3. Database at the time of submitting the quotation.

NB: IF A SERVICER PROVIDER IS FOUND TO BE EMPLOYED BY THE STATE AND IS ON THE CENTRAL SUPPLIERS DATABASE, THE SERVICER PROVIDER WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

23. TAX AND DUTIES

- 23.1. Prices, offered and paid, must include all customs, excise and import duties, and any other tariffs or taxes levied by the government or statutory body having jurisdiction on the goods provided under this contract, including Value Added Tax (applicable at the current rate).

24. TAX COMPLIANCE

- 24.1. Department will use the Central Supplier Database to verify the tax matters of the service provider. It is a condition of this quotation that the tax matters of a successful servicer provider be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the service provider's tax obligations.
- 24.2. The Tax Compliance status requirements are also applicable to service providers / individuals who wish to submit quotations.
- 24.3. It is a requirement that servicer providers grant a written confirmation when submitting this quotation that SARS may on an ongoing basis during the tenure of the contract disclose the service provider's tax compliance status and by submitting this quotation such confirmation is deemed to have been granted;
- 24.4. Where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved, each party must be registered on the Central Supplier Database and their tax compliance status will be verified through the Central Supplier Database
- 24.5. The state will not award a quotation to any service provider whose tax matters are not in order

25. UNSATISFACTORY PERFORMANCE

25.1. Unsatisfactory performance occurs when performance is not in accordance with the contract conditions.

- (i) The departmental official shall warn the contractor in writing that action will be taken in accordance with the contract conditions unless the contractor complies with the contract conditions and delivers satisfactory supplies or services within a specified reasonable time (7 days minimum). If the contractor does not perform satisfactorily despite the warning, the official will:
 - (a) Take action in terms of its delegated powers; and
 - (b) Make a recommendation to the Accounting Officer for cancellation of the contract concerned.
- (ii) When correspondence is addressed to the contractor, reference will be made to the contract number/item number/s and an explanation of the complaint.
- (iii) Signing of the SLA with DARD which details the ramifications in cases of unsatisfactory performance

26. VALIDITY PERIOD OF QUOTATION AND EXTENSION THEREOF

26.1. The validity (binding) period for the quotation will be 90 days from close of quotation. However, circumstances may arise whereby the department may request service providers to extend the validity (binding) period. Should this occur, the department will request service providers to extend the validity (binding) period under the same terms and conditions as originally offered for by service providers. This request will be done before the expiry of the original validity (binding) period.

27. VAT

27.1. All quotation prices must be inclusive of 15% VAT. Failure to comply with this condition will invalidate the quotation.

QUOTATION DISQUALIFYING FACTORS

1. All quotations received shall be evaluated on the following phases of evaluation:

- a. Stage one : Administrative Compliance
- b. Stage two : Functionality Criteria
- c. Stage three: Price and Specific Goals

2. Compulsory administrative compliance:

- a. Quotations must meet the Special Terms and Conditions in all aspects as stipulated in the quotation document.
- b. **Annexure B** (Service providers past experience) must be completed and signed by the service provider.
- c. All information required in the quotation document must be accurate and duly completed including all the appropriate signatures.
- d. Use of correction fluid is prohibited.
- e. Any alterations must be initialed.
- f. Under no circumstances may quotation forms be retyped or redrafted.
- g. Central Suppliers Database registration number.
- h. Compulsory site briefing certificate.

3. Compulsory Documents must be submitted with a quotation:

- a. An original or certified copy of the Resolution by the board of directors, personally signed by the chairperson of the board, authorizing the person who signs this bid to do so, as well as to sign any contract resulting from this bid and any other documents and correspondence in connection with this bid and/or contract on behalf of the company must be submitted with this bid, where applicable, as per SBD 11. (The date of the resolution must correspond on the Resolution letter and on the Authority to sign the bid (SBD 11)).
- b. Financial capacity: A pending approval letter from financial institution (i.e. Bank Letter) will not be considered.

- c. A certified copy of a valid BBBEE certificate or valid sworn affidavit (to prove ownership goal).
- d. The service provider must provide proof of Registration Certificates in their name for the three major raw materials used for fertilizer blends (Nitrogen, Phosphorus and Potassium) in accordance with the Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act 36 of 1947 as amended. Only valid certificates issued by a competent authority in the name of the company that tenders will be accepted, and such will be verified with the Registrar from National Department of Agriculture.
- e. The service provider must produce for all raw material (Nitrogen, Phosphorus and Potassium) a valid certificate of analysis (CA) issued in the name of the company. The certificate must be from a reputable laboratory as defined by the regulations of fertilizer issued in accordance with Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act 36 of 1947 as amended. All certificate presented will be verified with the Registrar from the National Department of Agriculture.
- f. The service provider to provide proof of membership for a minimum of one year in their company name with a recognized fertilizer association or council such as **FERTASA** (Fertilizer Association of Southern Africa).
- g. Servicer provider to provide proof that the logistics or transporting of the fertilizer will be subcontracted to a minimum of three BBBEE level 1 companies located within the KZN province.

4. **Functionality Evaluation Criteria**

- a. The quotation documents will be evaluated individually on score sheets, by a Representative evaluation panel, according to the below mentioned evaluation criteria (Relevant Experience, Financial Capacity, Equipment and Locality).

- b. All service providers who score less than minimum functionality score of 75% points will not be considered into the next stage.
- c. The evaluation criteria are as n Table 1 below:

5. Price and Specific Goals

- a. Procurement above R1M to R50M (80/20) the Department will allocate the Specific goal points as follows:
 - i. An EME or QSE entity which is at least 100 % **Black owned** will be awarded 20/20 points (as per the provisions of KZNDARD SCM Policy).


